# Visa, Registration & Other Key Information

Firstly, you will need to legalize and translate your documents if they are not in English, French, German or Dutch. Find your country on <u>Netherlands Worldwide</u>. For translation, the translator needs to be certified by a Dutch court - <u>Bureau Wbtv</u>.

- Check the Schengen Visa Advisor to see if you need a visa.

Check <u>I am Expat</u> to see if you need to apply for a provisional residence permit (MVV). Just note that this is in addition to the work permit you would apply for with your sponsor.

After moving to the Netherlands you need to register with the <u>local municipality</u>, get your BSN number and use this to open a bank account, get health insurance, and apply for benefits or allowances.
